## M&M's and Tweens

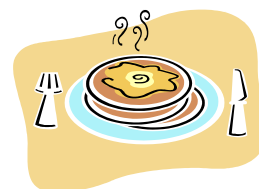

November 15

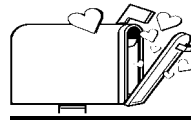
